

I was able to leave the State Operations Center to help out at the Austin Scale Model show on the 27th of September. This event is well reported to the club membership.

The next week I left for Dallas for two days and then moved on to Houston Area (Clear Lake TX) on the 10th of October.

On the 11th of October I made it to Pearland Texas for a Model Car Show. Lots of Cars and Venders. The amount of detail that these modelers could put under a hood was too much. Lots of chrome, sliver, mirrors and bright color paint. There was a trend to paint blushful figures, standing by the cars, wearing almost nothing.

On the 25th of October I made it back to the Austin Model Railroad Jamboree in Round Rock Texas. If you have not been to a train show in a while you need to. There were a lot of military models in all scales for sell. It seem there is a trend in loading trains with military items. Must be a war going on or something. I was able to pick

up a lot of skiing figures (HO scale) and a few vehicles. But I saw a lot of  $1/32^{\rm nd}$  scale Monogram models and older Bandi  $1/48^{\rm th}$  scale. After the show I had to return to Houston.

On the 26<sup>th</sup> I saw the Houston Air show from my third story office.

On the 27th Lattended a IPMS club meeting at Odyssey Hobbies in Clear Lake Texas. A small but well stock hobby shop which support the RC clubs. They have a great collection of Revel 1/100th scale model kits. The club is know as the "Galveston Bay Area scale Modelers Association". This club mainly builds 1/48th scale aircraft and rocket ships (more about that in a few) The meeting was held in front of the cash register close to 20 people attended with standing room only. The meeting went like this:

30 minutes to talk about The Austin Show with over 100 photos. I was able to point out most of our club members. This club own a few awards at the show.

30 minutes for a round robin about the projects that the member brought to the meeting. There were big planes and a lot of Rocket ships.

30 minutes about what is going on out in NASA. Yes a few of these guy's are real rocket scientists. They talked about a 8 wheel Luna rover, the next Mars Landers and other projects. Most of what they said was over my head and it was getting late for me. This club meets on the 4th Monday of month at 7:30

The big thing I notices is that Houston has not lost any Hobby shops but all have gotten smaller in size or their open times have been shorten.

On November 2<sup>nd</sup> I returned to Austin where on the 7<sup>th</sup> I left for Salt Lake City Utah (SLC). What a great town.

SLC has 4 big modeling shops to support the clubs in the area. All are doing areat business. On the 12th of November I made it to a IPMS club of SLC meeting, 16 members showed up. That's right real wooden ships, not just old time wooden hull but also modern ships but everything is made out of wood. That night was also a club raffle. I supported this club with my ten dollars and walked away with 4 books and two HO scale models. This club meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of the month at 7 PM.

**Eduard** has a new photo etch set for the Italeri PaK.97/38 75mm AT gun. Kit Number: 36057.


