Spiked Helmets

This is a Prussian Officer's 2nd Garde zu Foot, helmet with a white(1st or 2nd. btl.) parade horse hair brush on a gilt brass trichter; the black leather body with all gilt brass furniture, round base, star studs retainers and flat chin scales secured to the helmet body by a pair of style Kokards(left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). The front plate is a garde Prussian eagle, with a frosted silver garde star having an enameled Black Eagle Order in the center. Circa 1914. Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos**.



The next image is a Pommersches Pioneer-Batl. Nr. 2 Officer's spiked helmet. The black leather body with frosted silver furniture, round base, gilt star studs retainers and gilt flat chin scales secured to the helmet body by a pair of Officer style Kokards(left side is in the state color sblack & white and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). The front plate is a frosted silver Prussian infantry eagle. Circa 1910. Photograph by Thomas Pachalos.

The third image is a Prussian wartime Jaeger enlisted shako. The black leather stiff body with rounded front and rear visors, reinforced by a bead of leather. The front plate is field grey metallic Jaeger style eagle.

Side posts are of M-91 pattern with a matching black leather chin strap, having grey metal buckles. A black horse hair parade brush over a white and black Prussian field badge, worn at the top front of the helmet, with the national three colored kokard on the right side. Special note: when using the field badge the state kokard is not used. Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The fourth image is a Prussian wartime Uhlan enlisted Tschapka. The body of the helmet, including the visor is black leather. The mortarboard base is black painted metal with a number of vent holes around the neck of the base. The fittings are field grey metal and the chin strap is of black leather with grey metal buckles. Kokards (left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors:

black, white & red). Special note: in service, the top would not be worn.



The fifth image is a Prussian wartime Artillery enlisted helmet. The body of the helmet including the visors are black leather. The fittings are field grey metal and the chin strap is of black leather with grey metal buckles, in place of a spike is a "cannon ball". Kokards(left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The sixth image is a Prussian wartime Jaeger enlisted shako. The black leather stiff body with rounded front and rear visors, reinforced by a bead of leather. The front plate is field grey metallic jaeger style eagle. Side posts are of M-91 pattern with a matching black leather chin strap, having grey metal buckles. A white and black Prus-

sian field badge, worn at the top front of the helmet, with the national three colored kokard on the right side and state colored black and white on the left. Special note: when using the field badge the state kokard is not used. Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The seventh picture is a Prussian wartime Garde Jaeger enlisted shako. The black leather stiff body with rounded front and rear visors, reinforced by a bead of leather. The front plate is field grey metallic garde star style front plate. Side posts are of M-91 pattern with a matching black leather chin strap, having grey metal buckles. The national three colored kokard on the right side and state colored black and white on the left. Special note: when using the field badge the state kokard is not used. Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The eighth picture is a Baden wartime infantry enlisted helmet. The body of the helmet including the visors are black leather. The fittings are field grey metal and the chin strap is of black leather with grey metal buckles, with a griffin front plate in grey metal. Kokards (left side is in the state color yellow & orange

and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The ninth image is a Prussian Ersatz wartime Reserve enlisted pressed felt helmet. The body is pressed field grey felt. All the fittings are chemically subdued brass and the front plate is the Prussian infantry style with a reservist cross superimposed on the eagles breast. M-91 side post, leather chin strap with field grey metal buckles and Kokards (left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). (Damaged front plate, eagle is missing the orb.) Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The tenth image is a Prussian Ersatz wartime enlisted pressed felt helmet. The body is pressed field grey felt. All the fittings are field grey metal and the front plate is the Prussian infantry style. M-91 side post, leather chin strap with field grey metal buckles and Kokards(left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**

The eleventh image is a Prussian wartime enlisted helmet. The body of the helmet including the visors are black leather. The fittings are field grey metal and the chin strap is of black leather with grey metal buckles. Kokards(left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors: black, white & red). Photograph by **Thomas Pachalos.**



The final image is is a Prussian wartime Ersatz pattern 1917 steel spiked helmet. Stamped steel body with separately affixed leather liner. The painted field grey body with brass front plate, spike and M-91 side posts. Leather chin strap with brass buckles. Kokards(left side is in the state color black & white and the right is in the national colors:


