

the armor they could muster in their final large scale offensive of WWII: *Operation Nordwind*.

Throughout January of 1945, the men of US VI Corps didn't feel as if the war were coming to an end as they bore the brunt of the German offensive in Alsace-Lorraine. Incredulously, Hitler's primary objective given to his commanders was "the destruction of the enemy forces". Considering the weight and ratio of forces against the Germans, winning a war of attrition at that point in time can only be seen as the ridiculous goal of a mad man. Nonetheless, the Germans did inflict heavy damage, as the US VI Corps alone suffered almost 15,000 casualties.

Along with the savage fighting, the bitter cold and snow in Europe that winter did provide us with many

memorable images which we as historians and modelers can appreciate.








Tamiya's 1/35th Jagdpanzer IV/70 Lang features brand new tooling with nothing in common with its ancient 1970s release.
