A Farewell to Our Friend Pat Rourke

he news of our friend Pat Rourke's passing was a shock to us all. He was only 53 when he passed away in his sleep late last month. He is survived by his daughter Melissa.



Born and raised in the California Bay Area, Pat came to Texas in 1982 when his father relocated to Austin for a position with Lockheed. During his lifetime Pat had a few career changes, and he

spent the last 14 years (up to his last day) working for ABC Home & Commercial Services.

Pat started building scale models at a very young age. While he built anything that interested him, by and large he was an armor modeler. He was known for his exceptional building

skill. Plastic, resin, photo-etch, and white metal made no difference to his "chunky" figures; he could tackle them with ease like no one else. In fact, he loved to dazzle his models with aftermarket parts. Too often he felt miserable when building a kit straight out-of-the-box!

Unlike most modelers who have a tendency of having too many unfinished kits on their benches, Pat always insisted working on one model at a time. The word "collector" never existed in his dictionary, and he was one of the most prolific modeler we have ever seen.

Until his recent "slow down" from attending local and regional shows, Pat was a force to be reckoned with when it comes to model competition. Rarely did he not place in every category he participated in, he had won more special awards than everyone else in our club. Everyone remembers "Pat the Giant" who walked funny and spoke with a deep



Looking back through the historical archives for project inspiration, we find this month to be the 75th anniversary of the German invasion of Yugoslavia and Greece in April 1941. 
AABS New Website By Roderick Bell

blog. Here are a few examples that will be part of the carousel:










Below the carousel will be section buttons that will take you to additional features of the website. Here they are:


Meetings

This feature allows you to retrieve previous newsletters since July 2002.




Gallery

AMPSCentex


This feature will show our current as well as previous shows. This is still under construction





Videos


This feature allows us to view our videos or others on the internet. More contents are needed.

This feature allows a connection to our presence on Facebook.


Navigation






Half-tracks


