Last Coke Machine In Aleppo

he idea for this 1/35th diorama is based on images over the Internet on the recent Syrian Civil War. The scene consists of two tankers from a ZSU-57-2 taking a selfie in front of the last Coke machine in Aleppo that has not been blown up!

I will be using the Takom's latest ZSU-57-2 SPAAG, Meng's Vending Machine & Dustbin set (SPS-018), and two resin figures from Paracel Miniatures. For reference, I will be using the Osprey book on ZSUs.

Construction of the ZSU-57-2 is very DML like. I especially like the plastic fuel tank piping that comes with the kit. In Tamiya's T-55, you have to make





your own from brass. Here you can see the turret interior is complete with full ammo load painted and loaded, sans one clip. The kit comes with plenty of ammo. I just miscounted how many to paint and was short one clip.





The ZSU-57-2 was painted in basic Syrian camo colors. The scheme was based on the MIG paint guide provided with the kit. Currently, most armor being used in the Syrian conflict are overall tan. The ZSUs were brought out of reserve for use due to battlefield attrition, so I decided to go with the older Syrian camo colors.



The Figures

Paracel Miniatures is a new company based in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam (www.paracelminiatures.com). The two figures came from the "Selfie" kit (MW3503). To make them look more Middle Eastern, I added more facial hair to their faces...



The Base

Based on all the ANNA videos I've seen of the Syrian fighting, all the buildings look to me as shades of tan/grey. The building ruins are some plaster elements I had laying around. The bricks were made via a J's Models rubber mold. The street was made to look like cement by using a grey colored grout that I have. Ground cover is tan grout as I was going for a sandy look.

I applied a brownish wash to all the bricks/cider blocks to tone them down some. Next I added some paper type garbage laying around, and it called it done.


